

Kennicott's Grove National Historic Landmark

The Kennicott House

Located within the Village of Glenview, The Grove National Historic Landmark is a 124-acre remnant of degraded pre-settlement landscape owned and managed by the Glenview Park District. The ultimate goal during project planning was ecological restoration of wetland, prairie, and savanna ecosystems at The Grove. Ecological restoration refers to the process of renewing and maintaining the health or integrity of the existing ecological systems. In addition, the plans had to assist in the recovery of four endangered species - one reptile, one raptor, and two plant species.

AES prepared plans and specifications for ecological restoration activities at The Grove, and continues to be involved with oversight during implementation of the plan. Implementation work has been funded by numerous sources, including grants from Chicago Wilderness and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.
